

Montrose/Museum District 🎏 🏛

(Approximately 6 miles from The Westin Galleria)

Dare to be different? The Montrose District, developed in 1911, is a pocket of eccentricity and diversity in the heart of Houston. From neon-lit tattoo parlors and 24-hour drive-thrus to tree-covered bungalows and quaint coffee shops. Spend an afternoon perusing Montrose's vast array of art galleries, eclectic boutiques, antique shops, unique eateries and "anything goes" atmosphere.

Houston's Museum District is an epicenter of art and culture with 19 cultural institutions, including Museum of Fine Arts Houston (nation's sixth largest art museum), Holocaust Museum (nation's fourth largest Holocaust Museum) and Museum of Natural Science (founded in 1909), nestled in picturesque Hermann Park. "The Houston Museum District Association is dedicated to collaborative efforts that maximize use of the artistic, scientific and educational resources of Houston Museum District institutions by all citizens of and visitors to Houston." The Heights

The Heights, approximately 15 minutes/8 miles from the hotel, was described by a National Geographic Traveler as an area that "maintains a quirky sense of individuality" and "flourishes as a destination for foodies, architecture buffs and creative types." The Heights was one of the earliest planned communities in Texas.

A stroll along **19th St.** offers an array of boutique shops, coffee houses, and restaurants, as well as the newly restored **Heights Theater (theheightstheater.com)**, where local and national performers entertain the community.
