TAYLOR & FRANCIS AS THE NEW PUBLISHER OF THE
INTERNATIONAL JOURNAL OF GROUP PSYCHOTHERAPY

NEW YORK, September 21, 2015 – The American Group Psychotherapy Association (AGPA) announced that Taylor & Francis will be the new publisher of the *International Journal of Group Psychotherapy (IJGP)* commencing with the January 2016 issue.

In this new arrangement, the *IJGP* will continue to fulfill its mission of advancing clinical practice and research in the field, serving as an important resource for those interested in group therapy and its role in the larger mental health community. The *IJGP*'s articles and reviews will continue to offer insight into the current field of group psychotherapy, including theory, empirical research, practice models, and reviews of up-to-date research. In addition to peer-reviewed articles, the journal regularly publishes the following:

The journal's editor is Dr. Dominick Grundy, a Certified Group Psychotherapist currently practicing in New York. Associate Editor Dr. John V. Caffaro is a Fellow of the AGPA and a Distinguished Professor at the California School of Professional Psychology in Los Angeles. He is also the author of *Sibling Abuse Trauma: Assessment and Intervention Strategies for Children, Families, and Adults*.

Also as part of the new publishing arrangement, the entire *IJGP* series dating back to its inaugural year (1951) is being digitized. Subscribers will be able to search for specific articles, authors, or topics in the entire library of this seminal publication in the field of group psychotherapy. This will broaden the pool of digital resources and provide a unique and valuable perspective of the growth and development of this ever-evolving field.
